I was in DC on that day, just another college student waking to the horror. Although the threat was in my backyard, I felt a million miles away. As classes were cancelled and students came together to pray and help in any way they could, I couldn't shake the feeling of being numb and achy. Even today, watching the news footage ties my stomach in knots. It's a helpless feeling.

“None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself.”

How easy is it to fall into hate and fury. How easy it is to be the spiteful servant, forgetting the mercy of his master and magnifying his fury. However you were affected by 9/11, we replay this same drama over and over again in our lives: Hurt and pain turn into spite and suffering. We perpetuate the cycle when we cannot forgive. I enjoin you to think about this forgiveness in a

larger sense, as well. Have you forgiven “the failures of the past that continue to haunt,” as we often say in our liturgy? Often the most relevant forgiveness must begin within ourselves—only then can forgiveness beget forgiveness.

The History

If you are a long-time Saint Andrew parishioner, you are familiar with Fr. Matthias' annual trips to our parish over the past 10 years. Since being introduced to the parish in 2001, thousands of dollars have been raised to fund projects such as buying bicycles for the catechists that minister remote "outstation" communities, fixing broken water wells, rehabilitating Catholic schools, and providing academic scholarships for students and families in need.

Fr. Matthias's unique role "on the ground" as a priest and administrator ensures our donations directly impact the people who need it most. No overhead, no confusion. We look forward to his visit again soon (tentatively planned for October!).

Why Immersion?

The tradition of immersion is strong in the Catholic faith and rooted in social teaching. Catholic Relief Services, which was formed after WWII to assist impoverished and disadvantaged people overseas puts it this way: "Immersion experiences can be transformative insofar as they take us into the reality of others in a personal way and provide opportunities for reflection, social analysis and ongoing action and commitment."

Notice the use of the word "ongoing." While financial sponsorship is important, a deeper connection to Uganda is not possible without more faith witnesses. More than anything our aim is to live like a Ugandan for the 11 days of our visit. We seek to break down any historic feelings of superiority or inferiority. We seek a mutual deepening of the relationship between "us" and "them." Only then can we begin to walk in the shoes of our brothers and sisters.

How You Can Help

There are many ways you can help the travelers on the Uganda Immersion Trip:

- **Pray!** Pray for your brothers and sisters going on the trip. Keep us in your thoughts and prayers regularly, and we will keep you in ours.
- **Inquire!** Find ways to engage someone going on the trip. Ask them questions, talk to them about their efforts. Perhaps you have done a similar trip or had a similar experience abroad. Sharing those experiences conveys their power and helps us better prepare for our encounter.
- **Donate!** Quite simply, the trip is cost prohibitive for some of the people attending. However, we will not raise a dime without designating part of the proceeds directly to Fr. The Triumph of the Cross

On September 14th the Church celebrates the great Feast of the Triumph of The Cross. Jesus said “greater love has no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends” (Jn 15:13). Jesus accepted each and every human person as his own, and was ready to suffer and even die for us on the Cross. The Cross reminds us that Christ conquers sin and death not by might or worldly power but by the spirit of God (Zechariah. 4-6) He triumphed over hatred, arrogance, cruelty and anger by the love of the Cross. By reflecting on the remarkable prayer that Jesus prayed on the Cross, we too can overcome hatred and anger in the world. “Father forgive them for they know not what they do” (Lk 23:34). Here, Jesus asked his Father to forgive all those who put him to death; no anger, no self pity- only love. It is by this love and the power of God that Jesus won victory over Satan and sin.

While praying in Gethsemane, Jesus saw the enormity of suffering which he would experience on the cross. He saw it all and he could not bear it. Jesus became so tense that he began to sweat blood and there he prayed “Father, this is too much. I cannot bear it all. Let this bitter chalice go away from me.” And then he added, “But Father, not my will, let Your Will be done.” (Mt 26:39). An angel came, and Jesus saw that it was his Father’s will, part of the great plan of salvation that he would suffer and die on the Cross. Jesus said, “Father, I accept it all from your hands. Not my will, let Your Will be done.” (Mt 26:42). From that instant, Jesus accepted everything that happened to him from the hands of his Heavenly Father.

And so, every bit of Christ’s suffering became an act of love. From then on, the cross became the sign of salvation. For everyone who identifies with Christ, suffering is no more a curse; it is a participation in God’s plan of salvation. As we celebrate this feast, let us look into our lives. We suffer often; things go wrong with us. Others insult us, they humiliate us and they spread rumors about us. We become sad and broken. At such moments, we shall remember that our suffering is a sharing in the suffering of Christ. We can say with Christ, “I accept it all from the hands of the Father.” Indeed, if someone insults me and I am angry with him, the cross did not triumph. I have become a victim of anger and sin. I am not sharing in the suffering Jesus experienced when he was insulted while on the cross. I should look at the friend who insulted me and I should love him. When I am sick, I should not be desperate. I will look at the Cross and say “My Lord, I offer my cross to you.” That is the moment my cross triumphs, my sufferings triumph.



St. Maria Goretti was but a young girl from a small village in Italy when a young man tried to molest her. He made repeated advances and threatened to kill her if she did not comply. But Maria responded, “I belong to Jesus. My body belongs to the Lord. My body shall not be touched with the power of lust.” Even when he held the knife against her, she kept resisting, telling him, “No! It is a sin! God does not want it!” Alessandro first choked Maria, but she continued to insist that she would rather die than submit to him. Alessandro fatally stabbed Maria fourteen times before he ran away. Even as she lay dying, Maria prayed for Alessandro’s conversion. Three years after her death, Alessandro repented and changed his way of life. He had had a dream in which Maria came and offered to him white lilies. After his release from prison, Alessandro visited Maria’s mother and begged her forgiveness. She forgave him, saying that if Maria had forgiven him on her deathbed, then she couldn’t do less and they attended Mass together the next day - receiving the Holy Communion side by side. Alessandro reportedly prayed every day to Maria Goretti and referred to her as “my little saint.” He attended her canonization in 1950. Alessandro later became a Capuchin brother, living a life of prayer until his death.

The secular powers could have only destroyed Alessandro as a rightful retribution for his act of cruelty. But a young woman with the heart of Jesus could become more than a conqueror. She triumphed the very power of evil that was intent on destroying her. Defeating the power of Satan, she had established the Kingdom of God in the very life of her murderer.

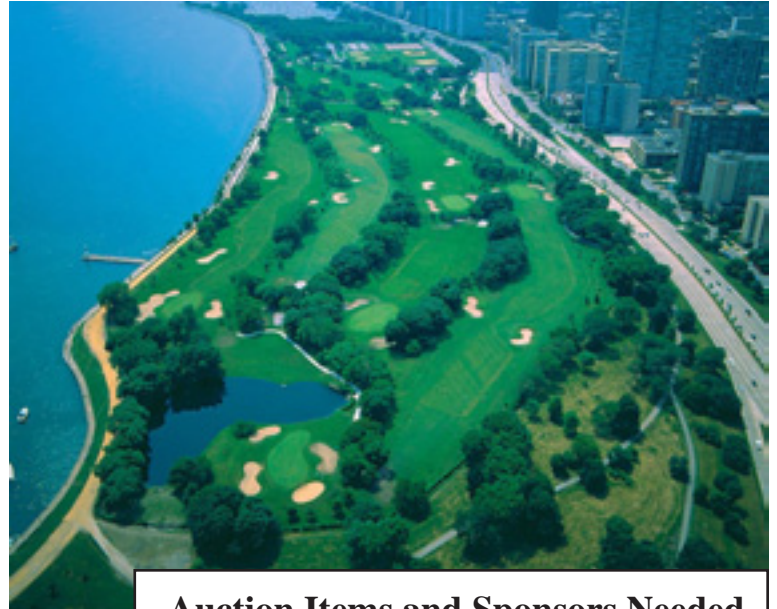
