Cursed is the one ... blessed is the one ...

For many in biblical times, wealth was a blessing and poverty a curse. Poverty was considered a judgment against the sins of a person. I am blessed because God loves me, regardless of how much money is tucked into my mattress. I am cursed by refusing to believe in God's love. God loves me either way.

So today we simply ask: am I blessed or am I cursed?

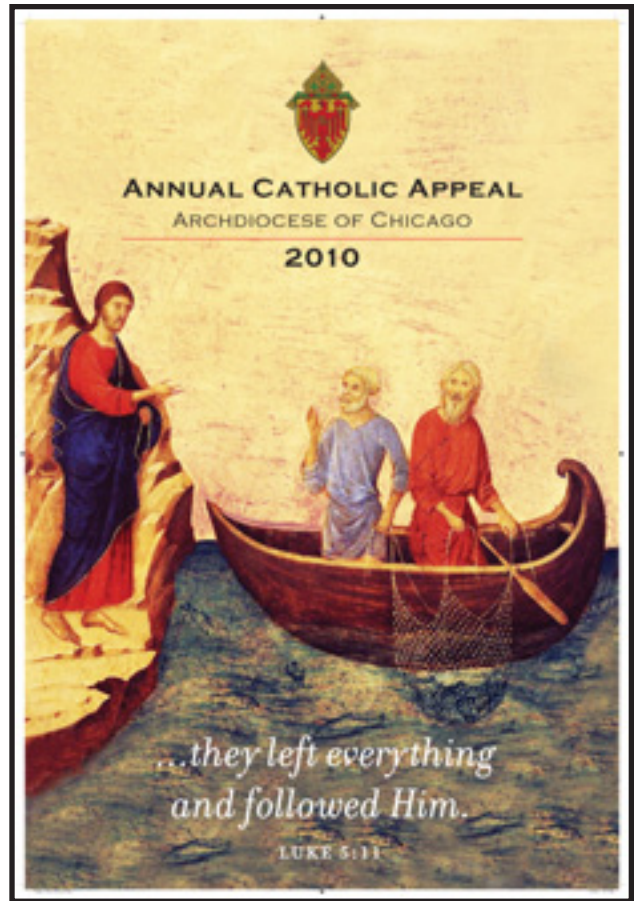

JOURNEY WITH JANET E's into Easter: Choose Life

From Ash Wednesday through Palm Sunday, we will follow a process of reflection and practice that will hopefully lead to a real metanoia – turning around – of our lives. Yes, we can still give up caffeinated coffee or chocolate; we can still observe the churches regulations surrounding fasting and abstinence – but through the 5 E's, we will be prepared to truly Embrace Easter and live as Alleluia people, with joy in the Risen Christ. Each Sunday you will be invited into a new step in the process as we reflect on Scripture, current events, questions of our faith. A brief outline of each E follows:

- Week 1: Examen** – inspection of your conscience, consciousness; critical study of one's work
- Week 2: Evaluate** – form a critical opinion of; make a judgment based on criteria
- Week 3: Eliminate** – remove, terminate
- Week 4: Experiment** – try something new; test idea
- Week 5: Establish** – set up or lay the groundwork
- Week 6: Embrace** – include in scope; a close affectionate and protective acceptance

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

Good Friday and Ash Wednesday are the major days for fasting, in general, for those who have reached the age 18 and are not yet 60. Abstinence means no meat on those days for those who are age 14 [or over]. The US rules for abstinence from meat includes all Fridays during Lent; Fast (small meals, no snacks) + Abstinence (as in universal rules — no meat) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

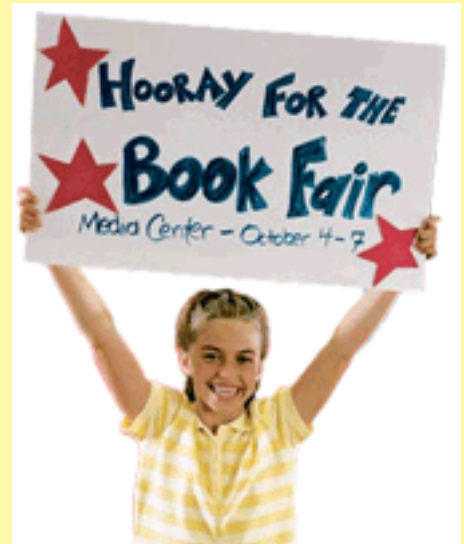

DID YOU EVER THINK ABOUT

The time in Mass when we say "Lord Have Mercy"? As we come closer to Lent perhaps we should look at these few words at Mass. Where ever we have been during the previous week or weeks, whatever we have done, this part of Mass calls us to consider the sinful weakness of our lives. Sin is relational. It involves our relationship to God, to others and ourselves. Sin separates us. Here before God and the community we pray "Lord Have Mercy." Do not hold our sinfulness against us, but HAVE MERCY. Do not give us what our sinfulness deserves. Rather, give us, your children, your creatures, the gift of Mercy. "Lord have Mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have Mercy. When we pray these simple few words, let us mean it.
