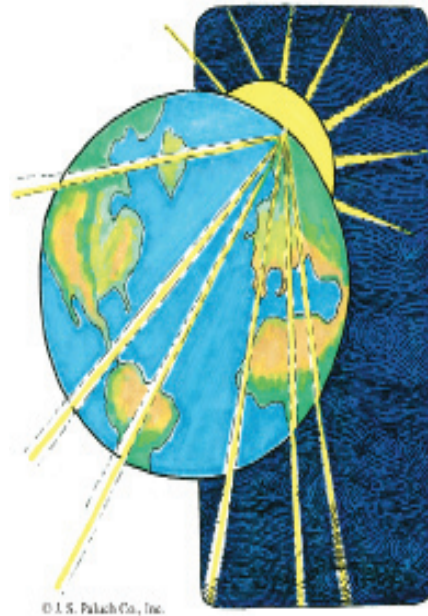

SAINT ANDREW SCHOOL HAPPENINGS

News from the Saint Andrew Library

Since we've come back from Christmas Break, our students have had a lot to read about.

The Kindergarten students learned about cumulative tales, also called "add-on stories", such as I Know an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Fly and The Old Lady Who Wasn't Afraid of Anything. Students learned how easy it is to read along to stories with repetitive patterns. (Tip for parents: if you want titles of more books like these to read with your children, contact Mr. Bergstrom.)

Our 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grade students all explored biographies and learned about autobiographies. We read about people like Pocahontas, Wilma Rudolph, Martin Luther King, Jr., Jesse Owens, and Abraham Lincoln. We also worked on summarizing the most important events of these people's lives.

Next month, Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade will again be doing author studies, this time reading books by Mo Willems (the "Pigeon" and "Pig and Elephant" books), Marc Brown (the "Arthur" book series), and Chris Van Allsburg (Jumanji, The Polar Express). Our 3rd graders will be exploring reading strategies for non-fiction texts. The 4th and 5th grades are spending their "Study Skills" periods working on strategies they can use on the upcoming Terra Nova tests.

Plus everyone will see a short DVD about the great books coming with our Scholastic Book Fair on February 17 & 18.

We were also lucky enough to have different teachers in our classrooms during teacher-swap, and collected a ton of change during the A+ for Africa penny challenge.

4th grade science students are continuing their study of the Earth. This past week was particularly eventful. Students worked in science groups to create volcano models. These models were then erupted to give us a better idea of the different parts of volcanoes and how they work together. Students have also been working hard on their science fair projects. Many have been turned in this week and look fantastic! We are looking forward to participating in the Saint Andrew School Science Fair next Thursday, February 17th to show off all of the hard work students put into their projects.

The 4th and 5th graders participated in a field trip this past week. To help with our study of the country and government, students visited the Copernicus Center to watch a play called "We the People". 4th and 5th graders learned more about democracy, the three branches of government, and the judicial process that makes our country great.

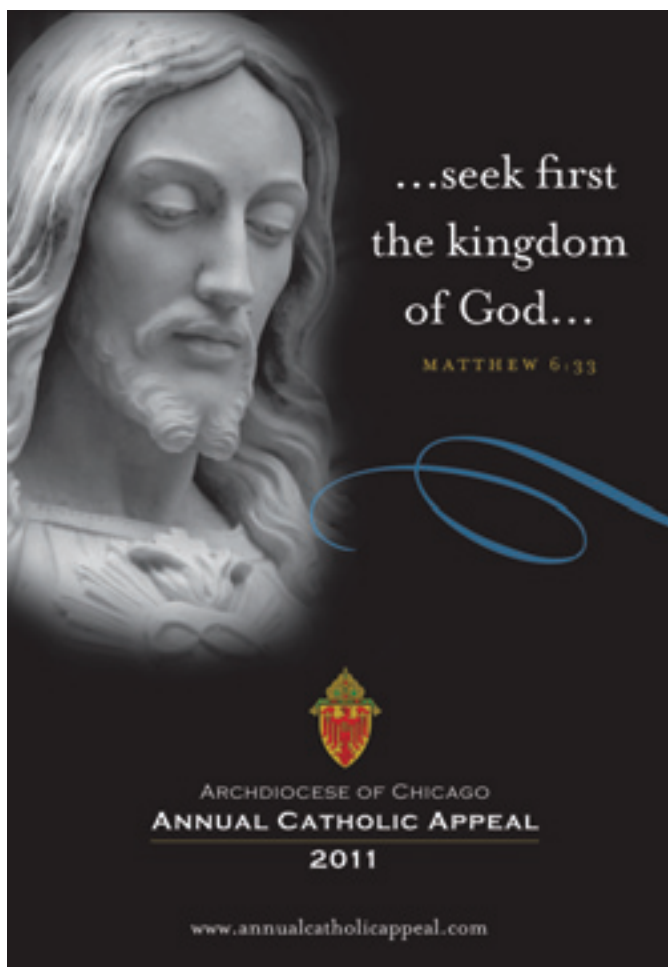
